# INDIVISIBLE CAMPAIGN

- **Expand early in-person voting and no-excuse absentee vote-by-mail to all states.**
- **Require states and jurisdictions to establish a publicly available contingency plan to enable eligible Americans to vote in the case of an emergency.**
- **Require the Election Assistance Commission to create a domestic version of the federal write-in absentee ballot.**
- **Require that all states provide envelopes with prepaid postage to all voters who request a voter registration application, absentee ballot application, or absentee ballot, and require that all states offer and accept online absentee ballot applications.**
- **Require absentee ballots to be counted if postmarked or signed before the close of the polls on Election Day.**
- **Provide money to states to implement these reforms.**

# What You Can Do To Ensure Your Vote Counts

- ★ Check your voter registration status whether or not you've voted recently. Use this handy tool for any person in any state from [Vote.org](#)
- ★ If you are not registered, go to the following sites to register online. You can also register by mail or in person (note the deadlines prior to the election):
  - NJ - 21 days

# Sign Up for Vote By Mail - NJ

- ★ Check your Vote by Mail status with the County Clerk's office. In Hunterdon, that's Mary Melfi. You cannot check online, you must call (908) 788-1221
- ★ You can get an application to Vote by Mail online. Print it out, complete it and mail it in. Do not fax or email it.

- ★ To receive your ballot by mail, the application must be received by the County Clerk 7 days prior to the election. A voter may also apply in person to the County Clerk until 3:00 p.m., the day before the election.
- ★ You have the option now of checking the box to get all future elections VBM.

# Vote by Mail - Pennsylvania

- ★ Registered voters can apply for a mail-in ballot online, by mail or in person at the county election office. You can contact your **county election office** directly to request a paper application, email [ra-voterreg@pa.gov](mailto:ra-voterreg@pa.gov) or call **1-877-VOTESPA**.

- ★ For the June 2 primary, applications for a mail-in ballot must be received by the county election office by 5 pm May 26.
- ★ Mail-in ballots will be issued beginning about 50 days prior to the election and must be turned in by 8:00 pm the day of the election to the County Board of Elections.
- ★ You now have the option to request to be added to an annual mail-in ballot request list where you'll receive an application to renew your mail-in ballot request each year. Once your application is approved, you will automatically receive ballots for the remainder of the year, and you **do not** need to submit an application for each election.

## ***Alert For All Those Who Vote by Mail***

***Make sure you read the instructions on the ballot and the mail-in envelope carefully and follow them exactly.***

***Incorrect handling can invalidate the ballot.***

***You can mail or turn in your mail-in ballots in-person to the county board of elections in your respective states.***
