Express outrage for Congressional Republicans' attacks on the courts.

Call your Representative. Suggested script: "I'm calling to say that I'm outraged by Congressional Republicans' attacks on the courts. I want the Congressman to vote no on H.R.1702 the JUDGES Act, which would allow President Trump to appoint 22 new lifetime federal judges, enabling him to stack courts with loyalists. I want the Congressman to vote no on H.R.1789 the PEPPER Act, which would dramatically expand executive power by allowing officials to move cases against them from state to federal courts. And I want the Congressman to vote no on H.R.1526 the NORRA Act, which would severely restrict federal judges' ability to issue nationwide injunctions against unconstitutional executive actions. The National Security Signal Leak & What Congress Must Do Next

On March 24, 2025, the same day The Atlantic revealed the administration had leaked its own war plans in a Signal group chat, the U.S. Senate confirmed Christopher Landau as Deputy Secretary of State in a 60-31 vote. Restore USDA Funding for Food Banks and Schools

The administration recently cut federal programs providing over a billion dollars annually to help schools and food banks buy food from local farms. The USDA has also significantly reduced shipments to food banks and food kitchens from The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) without explanation or warning. In addition to feeding the hungry, these programs also support the local food production economy, especially in more rural areas, and farmers are already being affected.
